Fort Reno, just a military camp in 1874, was established as a military post in February of 1876. Construction of permanent buildings also began in 1876. Fort Reno and the Darlington Agency, which served the Cheyenne and Arapaho Indians across the Canadian River, together preserved the peace and directed the orderly transition of this part of the Indian Territory from reservation to individual farms and ranches. Troops from Fort Reno supervised the first great Land Run of 1889 that opened the Unassigned Lands for settlement.

The Fort also served as one of three re-mount depots from 1908 through 1947 when the lands were transferred to the United States Department of Agriculture for an agricultural research station. In 1997 the USDA agreed to the establishment of the Fort Reno Visitor Center as a non-profit entity to provide historical information to the public and coordinate fundraising efforts to preserve and rehabilitate the historic structures at Fort Reno.
